### *Tour Liberty Hall Plantation & Cowan Museum*

This Kenan family home is Duplin County's number one historic site. Built by Thomas Kenan in the early 1800s, this home was restored to its original elegance and beauty in 1964. Liberty Hall is furnished with beautiful and unusual antiques including some of the home's original pieces. "Christmas by Candlelight" celebration at Liberty Hall is held the first weekend in December. The home is resplendent with period holiday decorations and period costumed guides. Located directly next door is Cowan Museum which showcases a collection of antiques from farm equipment to cooking utensils and everything in between.

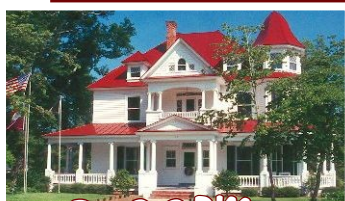
### *Dine at the Country Squire Restaurant*

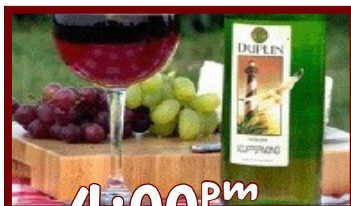
### *Tour L. P. Best House (Vet's Museum)*

The L. P. Best House/Duplin County Veterans Museum serves as a repository for local military artifacts, memorabilia and a special ongoing Roll of Honor for those who served. Four thousand veterans are currently listed on the Roll of Honor. See firsthand how the American military has developed over the years and learn the history of the American Wars. In conjunction with the Veterans Museum, Warsaw's Armistice Day celebration, that later became Veterans Day, is now the oldest, consecutive celebration of Veterans Day in the nation, having started in 1921.

### *Visit Duplin Winery; Production Tour and a Wine Tasting*

Duplin Winery is the oldest and largest winery in the state. It produces award-winning wines made with a 200-year-old recipe from native Muscadine Scuppernong grapes. Tasting tours, vineyard tours, dinner shows and a friendly welcome are all a part of what makes this a favorite Duplin County attraction. Duplin Winery's roots trace back to the 1970s. The winery offers free daily tours of its state-of-the-art production facility and free daily tastings of its award winning muscadine wines. This serves as a great stop which offer hours of entertainment at no cost to you or your participants.
